Since January 2017 all our editorial flow has been migrated to the *Open Journal System - OJS* platform. It is through OJS that we will receive all submissions of articles.

We are grateful for the gracious and qualified participation of the peer reviewers and the members of our Editorial Board, which includes representatives from prestigious institutions in many countries and different states in Brazil.
